Manuscripts Special Collections—Dewey Collection

Clapp, Elsie Ripley Papers

1910-1943

Personal papers, education material, correspondence, and instructional material document Elsie Ripley Clapp's career as an educator and a promoter of John Dewey's education theories. The bulk of the collection relates to Dewey. Included among Clapp's education material are lists of courses she took at Teachers College and Columbia University (1907-1911), and a list of Dewey's courses she assisted from 1912 to 1927, when he withdrew from active teaching at Teachers College. In addition, there are several letters from Dewey as well as lecture notes and some manuscript material. Clapp's most significant community education project was Arthurdale, a West Virginia community created as a homestead for unemployed miners on land purchased by the federal government. Scrapbooks and newsclippings document this project as well as the Rosemary and Ballard Schools. The collection also contains material used by Clapp in writing her book, *The Use of Resources in Education* (1952).

Dewey, John Papers

1858-1970

Philosopher, educator, and social critic John Dewey influenced public life for well over half a century, and his thoughts continue to provide grist for academicians, educators, and reformers. Best known for his theories of education, Dewey also wrote major works treating experience and nature, art and experience, logic and inquiry, democracy, and ethics. His academic career encompassed service on the faculties of the University of Michigan, the University of Chicago, and Columbia University.

The John Dewey Papers constitute the largest extant body of original Dewey sources available for research. Included within the collection are correspondence, manuscripts and lecture notes (both Dewey's own notes and students' transcriptions), published works, tape recordings and films, and photographs. Correspondence comprises at least half of the collection and is split fairly evenly between family and professional correspondence. Dewey did not customarily make copies of his own letters; hence, most of the letters in the collection are to Dewey. Significant correspondents include Albert C. Barnes, Henri

Bergson, William M. Brown, Martin Buber, George S. Counts, Albert Einstein, William Rainey Harper, Sidney Hook, William James, George Herbert Mead, Joseph Ratner, Bertrand Russell, George Santayana, Leon Trotsky, and James Hayden Tufts. Many of these luminaries are represented by only a few letters; more extensive professional correspondence documents

administrative difficulties within the School of Education at the University of Chicago; Dewey's collaboration with Arthur F. Bentley, culminating in the 1949 volume *Knowing and the Known*; and Dewey's interest in work in the psychology of visual perception done by Dartmouth research professor Adelbert Ames. Also included are letters illuminating Dewey's courtship of his first wife Alice Chipman, his impressions of Chicago circa 1894, his ruminations during the Asian sojourn of 1919-1921, and his thoughts concerning the Trotsky hearings he chaired in Mexico in 1937. Manuscript material contains Dewey's manuscripts of articles and books, his lecture notes, and notes taken by students.

Along with the personal and professional papers of John Dewey, Morris Library holds a collection of books belonging to Dewey and members of his two families. The library includes numerous books signed or annotated by Dewey (well over a hundred feature marginalia) or inscribed to him.

Special Collections—European History

Envoy Papers

1949-1951

Published and unpublished manuscripts, literary correspondence, and business material document *Envoy*, *A Review of Literature and Art*. During its brief existence, *Envoy* published the work of a broad range of Irish and other writers. The first to publish J. P. Donleavy, Brendan Behan's first short stories and poetry, and an extract from Samuel Beckett's "Watt," *Envoy* was begun by John Ryan, a Dublin artist, who served as editor. Among the associate editors were Valentin Iremonger, Irish diplomat and poet who served as poetry editor, J. K. Hillman, Michael Huron, and Owen Quinn.

Hinkson, Katharine Tynan Papers

1882-1949

The Katharine Tynan Hinkson collection is comprised principally of three series: correspondence, manuscripts, and a miscellaneous assortment of newspaper clippings, booklets, souvenirs, and personal effects. The collection is extensive and offers insight into Tynan's creative process as well as her life. The correspondence, covering the years 1885-1929, contains over 200 letters to Tynan.

O'Mahony, Eoin Selected Papers

1912-1971

The Selected Papers of Eoin O'Mahony, barrister, genealogist, newspaper columnist, radio personality, and lecturer, mainly document his time spent as a Visiting Professor in the Southern Illinois University at Carbondale Department of Journalism in 1966 and as Visiting Artist in 1967. O'Mahony's papers include correspondence, several manuscripts, and various printed matter about O'Mahony. The correspondence consists of over 100 letters to and from O'Mahony,

the majority of which were written between 1965 and 1971. Much of the correspondence concerns O'Mahony's activities at and on behalf of Southern Illinois University, including many responses to his inquiries about the manuscripts of twentieth-century Irish writers, which he was trying to help obtain for Morris Library Special Collections.

O'Riordan, Conal Correspondence

1907-1942

The Conal O'Riordan collection consists primarily of letters to O'Riordan during his short tenure as director of the Abbey Theatre, following the death of John Millington Synge. Most of the letters are related to Abbey Theatre activities. The collection of over seventy letters covers the years 1907 to 1923, with the exception of one letter dated 1942.

Ussher, Arland Selected Correspondence

1921-1959

This collection of selected correspondence of Arland Ussher, philosopher, art critic, and Gaelic scholar, consists largely of an exchange of letters between Joseph Hone, Irish critic and biographer, and Ussher. There are over 200 letters, most of them to or from Hone. The collection also includes letters from Edmund Blunden, Austin Clarke, Oliver St. John Gogarty, Jack Grene, Augustus John, William Kirkpatrick Magee, Sacheverell Sitwell, and Robert N. D. Wilson.

Manuscripts Special Collections—James Joyce

Feinberg, Charles E. Collection of James Joyce

[1904-1937]

The Collection is comprised almost entirely of correspondence from or about Joyce. The bulk of the letters represents Joyce's correspondence with James B. Pinker, a London literary agent who, at H.G. Wells' suggestion, offered his services to Joyce in 1915. The remaining letters were written by Joyce's wife Nora, Paul Leon, Caresse Crosby, Sylvia Beach, J.W.N. Sullivan, Ben W. Huebsch, and Lawrence Pollinger. Two series of letters provide a background for the first American edition of *Ulysses*. There is also an exchange between Caresse Crosby and J.W.N. Sullivan in which the latter declines Crosby's invitation to write an introduction for the Black Sun Press edition of *Tales Told of Shem and Shaun*. Joyce's contract with the Crosbys for that 1929 edition is also included in the collection.

Manuscripts Special Collections--Miscellaneous

Craddock, Ida Papers

1877-1902

Correspondence, manuscripts, and printed material document the activities of religious leader, Ida C. Craddock. Ms. Craddock was a Priestess and Pastor of the Church of Yoga, a member of the Unitarian faith, and a student of religious eroticism. Her publications and lectures were condemned as obscenities by some and praised for their educational value by others.

Crawford, Monroe C. Papers

1834-1919

Biographical material, correspondence, and newspaper clippings document the activities of lawyer, judge, Civil War veteran, and politician, Monroe C. Crawford.

Crosby, Caresse Papers

1912-1970

Correspondence, literary manuscripts, biographical material, scrapbooks, photographs, and published material comprise the largest extant body of material documenting Caresse and Harry Crosby's literary, printing and publishing, and personal accomplishments. The correspondence series included not only letters to and from prominent figures in the literary world, but also enclosures of manuscripts, artwork, and other material. Notable correspondents include Kay Boyle, Harry Crosby, D. H. Lawrence, Henry Miller, and Ezra Pound. Manuscripts include Caresse Crosby's poems, short stories, and plays, as well as autobiographical materials. These include early typescripts of *The Passionate Years*, its unpublished sequel "Who in the World," and an unpublished collection of correspondence entitled "Letters to the Editor." Also included in this series are original drawings, prints of drawings, and photographs of sculpture done by Caresse Crosby while a student at the Atelier de la Grande Chaumiere. The Crosby Papers also include business materials, announcement, and advertising of the Black Sun Press.

Dent, Frederick Tracy Papers

1847-1894

Correspondence, a diary, and photographs comprise the papers of Ulysses S. Grant's brother-in-law, Frederick Dent. Dent served as Grant's aide-de-camp during the Civil War and as his military secretary at the White House after the war. The bulk of the correspondence documents this association.

Harwood Family Papers

1838-1924

The Harwood Family Papers contain material concerning the James Grizzard family and descendants, among them the Harwood Family. Of note are personal correspondence between James Grizzard and his children, dated after the Civil War. The bulk of the material in this collection concerns James C. Bandy, also known as James H. Barry, a grandson of James Grizzard, and a Union soldier (U.S. 6th Regiment) born in Nashville, Tennessee.

Lawler, Michael Kelly Papers

1819-1884

Correspondence, 1819-1884, forms the bulk of this collection documenting lawyer and soldier, Michael Kelly Lawler. Lawler served as a captain in the Mexican War and as a Major General alongside John A. Logan and John McClelland during the Civil War. Included in the collection are Lawler's official reports, 1864, outlining his military service and his personal copy of the *Official Army Register*, 1863. Also of note in the collection is legal material documenting the Crenshaw family of Gallatin, Illinois.

Loosley, Edwin A. Papers

1862-1865

The Edwin A. Loosley Papers contain more than 100 letters (plus fragments) from Pvt. Loosley (cook and baker with the 81st Illinois Volunteer Infantry) from the field, to his wife, Ann, in Du Quoin (Perry County), Illinois, and two diaries (1864 April 12-October 30, and 1864 November 23-1865 April 27).

Mann Family Papers

1831-1942

The bulk of this collection is correspondence between John Preston Mann and his wife, Nancy, during the time Mann served in the Civil War. In addition to the letters, Mann also kept diaries he sent to his wife as he filled up books.

Sullivan, Thomas Collection

1874-1944

Photographs, correspondence, a few certificates, some school rosters, newspaper clippings, and some miscellaneous items document the life of Civil War veteran and schoolteacher, Thomas Sullivan and his family. Sullivan enlisted in Company F, 40th Illinois Infantry, at Knob Prairie near Akin, Illinois and served three years.

Woodhull-Martin, Victoria Papers

1870-1962

Autobiographical material, correspondence, notes, and newspaper clippings document the activities of author, editor, lecturer, banker, member of the Society for Psychical Research, Victoria Woodhull-Martin. The collection covers such subjects as women's suffrage, free love, spiritualism, and astrology.

Wiley, Benjamin L. Papers

1817-1922

Correspondence, military records, and financial and legal material document the life of Civil War veteran Benjamin L. Wiley. The Correspondence Series consists mainly of family letters to Ben or his wife, Emily Davie Wiley, with the bulk of the letters during the years 1853 to 1878.

Manuscripts Special Collections—Southern Illinois, SIUC, and SINU

Carbondale Federated Women's Club Records

1953-1955

This small collection documents the 1953-1955 activities of the Carbondale Federated Women's Club, a civic organization dedicated to the artistic achievements and growth of women. Included are newspaper clippings, photographs of people and exhibits, and guest signatures from the first three All Egyptian Art Exhibits. Also included are two yearbooks.

Carbondale League of Women Voters Records

1958-1985

Publications, business records, reports and projects, correspondence, and printed material comprise the records of the Carbondale League of Women Voters. The Carbondale chapter was organized in 1926, but this collection does not contain any material prior to 1958. Publications form the bulk of this collection and includes material concerned with local, state and national issues.

Carbondale Railroad Relocation Authority Archives

1963-1969

The archives of the Carbondale Railroad Relocation Authority includes by-laws, minutes of meetings, February 5, 1966, to July 8, 1968, and correspondence from August 13, 1963, to July 15, 1969. The collection also includes financial papers such as bills vouchers, bank statements, monthly statements of allotments and expenditures, and audit reports.

Chapman Family Papers

1871-1975

Correspondence, photographs, a family scrapbook, autograph albums, and ephemera document the Chapman family of Carbondale. The bulk of the collection is photographs from the late 1800s to the early 1900s.

French, George Hazen Papers

1859-1931

Manuscripts, diaries, and record books document the life and activities of biologist, George Hazen French. The collection is comprised of his scientific observations as well as his reflections on various community members in Carbondale and Herrin, Illinois.

H.O.M.E. (Honor Our Men's Efforts)

1967-1972

Correspondence, newsletters, financial records, scrapbooks, and printed material document the efforts of a group of Carbondale women who shared the belief that they should do something to show their support for the men and women of the Carbondale area who had either volunteered for or been drafted into the service during the conflict in Vietnam.

Ibata, David Collection of Cairo Racial Strife

1969-1975

Research notes and transcripts of interviews document Daily Egyptian student editor-in-chief, David Ibata's research into race relations in Cairo, IL during the early 1970s. The interviews, conducted in 1975, are of various Cairo and State civic leaders and politicians. Included are Mayor James B. Walder; Cairo NAACP President, Preston Ewing; Rev. Larry Potts; and Lt. Governor, Paul Simon.

Joy, Verne E. Papers

1905-1968

Biographical material, correspondence, and business records document Verne E. Joy and the Centralia Sentiniel newspaper. The Sentinel had several production "firsts" for Southern Illinois, including the first Linotype, 1907; the first web perfecting press, 1909; the first tubular rotary press, 1920; the first full Associated Press leased wire, 1925; the first Gemmetal engraving plant; and first installation of teletypesetter equipment in 1934.

Pate Family Papers

1796-1850

The collection consists of a 1796 ledger copy book, eleven letters dated from 1839 to 1850, and a newspaper article on the death of Anthony Pate, son of Jackson County, Illinois pioneer Perlemon Pate, Sr. Eight of the letters are from Perlemon's brother Anthony in Louisiana. These letters relate many of the hardships in the way of life of a small cotton farmer trying to make a living in the 1840s. In the letters, Anthony describes the successes and failures of his crops, the prices that he gets for them, and the births, deaths, and illnesses of his large family.

Rink, L. A. Selected Papers

1919-1941

This collection is comprised of files of cases coming before the bench of L. A. Rink, Justice of the Peace in Cairo, Illinois. There is also a small amount of material relating to the Rink Grocery business and the Rink Collection Agency.

Shelton Gang United Press Articles

1943-1957

Photocopies of UP press sheets and a few newspaper clippings document the Shelton gang of southern Illinois. During the 1920s, the Shelton brothers, Earl, Carl, and Bernard, along with the notorious Charlie Birger gang, sold illegal liquor, opened gambling resorts, and committed numerous murders in Williamson, Saline, and Franklin counties.

Stegeman, Beatrice Collection

1960-1981

The Beatrice Stegeman Collection consists of materials relating to civil rights and women's liberation that were collected by Beatrice Stegeman, a former student at Southern Illinois University, while she was in college in the early 1960s. Stegeman was involved in various activities and organizations devoted to the cause of civil rights for African-Americans and women.

United Mine Workers of America 1919-1976

Organizational records, reports, contracts and agreements, election material and correspondence document UMW Local 5134 of Du Quoin, Illinois. The bulk of the material originated with Local President Charles Brosch.

Photographs

Special Collections—Southern Illinois and SIUC-SINU

Busch, C. Thomas

Manuscript Collection 189

These photographs were collected by Busch, a former SIU student, who served on the Student Advisory Committee for Master Plan III, Lieutenant Governor Paul Simon's Committee to Study Campus Unrest, and the Coordinating Task Force which dealt with the aftereffects of the May 1970 student unrest at SIU. Most of the photographs, taken by Daily Egyptian staff photographers, depict student protests from January through May 1970.

Colp, Harrison E.

Photograph Collection 39

ca. 1918 - 1925

This collection contains three groups of photographs. The first and largest group consists of 1918 U.S. government photographs of WWI scenes at the French front, including soldiers of the 33rd Illinois Division (with the 132nd regiment from Chicago); land and sea battles; battlegrounds; prisoners of war; post-battle landscapes; soldier ships; weaponry; local villages and people; and Major General George Bell, Jr., Commander of the 33rd Division. The second group of photos appears to document troops returning to New York City, and the third group consists of 25 photographs Colp took documenting the destruction of West Frankford, IL by the tri-state tornado of March 18, 1925.

Daily Egyptian

University Archives 35-1

This small collection contains miscellaneous photographs obtained in 1975 depicting student life, university services and staff, campus events and scenes, drama and dance performances, artwork, awards, buildings, Campus Lake, faculty, administrators, student organizations, and visiting

entertainers. The collection also includes images related to the School of Agriculture, the College of Education, the College of Liberal Arts, ROTC, the Airport, the School of Technical Careers (Vocational Technical Institute), the first class of the Medical School, scenes of Carbondale and Crab Orchard, and a photograph of Buckminster Fuller and his geodesic dome.

Feirich, Alice Parkinson
Photograph Collection 9
ca. 1840-1951

Alice Parkinson Feirich graduated from SINU in 1911 and taught at the Training School 1913-1920. Her father held various positions at SINU, including Secretary of the faculty, Registrar, and President. This collection complements Manuscript Collection 37 and contains photographs of the class of 1911, the 1951 reunion of the class of 1911, the Feirich family, SINU buildings, and turn of the century Southern Illinois houses.

Horrell, C. William
University Archives 20-3

Horrell was one of the founders of the SIUC Cinema and Photography Department; he authored photography textbooks and published several photograph books on southern Illinois. This collection contains documentary photography by Horrell; the bulk of the photographs depict Southern Illinois places, events, and people.

Mitchell, O.J.
Photograph Collection 18

This collection includes a variety of southern Illinois photographs, many of which were taken by A.M. Mitchell. It contains reprints of Charlie Birger, his family and gang, and the Birger hanging. Other photos depict the hangings of Joe Pack Smith and Joe Clemens, a 1952 Centennial parade, Devil's Bake Oven at Grand Tower, the George Dunn homestead in Equality, the 1937 Harrisburg flood, a coal mine tunnel, and Shawneetown scenes.

Parks, George E.
Photograph Collection 52

This collection depicts people, places, things, and events in Anna, Jonesboro, and other Union County, IL locations. Many of these photographs were used in the book, History of Union County (3 vols.) by Parks. The collection includes photos of an 1898 Cobden baseball team; a 1911 Anna Women's Club Garden Party; the 1895 Egyptian Cornet Band of Cobden; churches, cemeteries, memorials and markers; businesses, buildings, schools, and homes; farming scenes; scenery and wildlife; aerial views of Anna and Jonesboro; Bald Knob; and Frank Willard's "Moon Mullens" drawings.

Rickert Family
Photograph Collection 43

Joseph Rickert, of Waterloo, Illinois, was a lawyer, banker, politician, teacher, amateur historian, and civic leader. Rickert and his wife were long-time friends of Southern Illinois University and of Presidents Shryock and Morris. This collection includes many different types of photographs, including cyanotypes, albumen prints, platinum prints, tin types, stamp photos, and glass plate negatives. The collection, which complements Manuscript Collection 144, is divided into six series - people, places, events, things, unidentified, and oversize

University Archives 78

These photographs depict a variety of SIUC scenes, including sporting events, buildings, commencements, performances, faculty, administrators, fraternities and sororities, social events, and student activities.

Special Collections—Dewey Papers and Pictures

Dewey, John Photograph Collection 47

ca. 1859-1968

This sizable collection complements Manuscript Collection 102, the papers of John Dewey, eminent American philosopher-educator. The collection contains images of Dewey and his family members; John Dewey in China; assorted friends, colleagues and professional associates; Dewey-related places; and scenic shots and postcards from all over the world. Later photographs depict Roberta Dewey, after her husband's death.

Dewey School at the University of Chicago, the Lander MacClintock Collection of Photograph Collection 46

ca. 1896-1903

MacClintock attended Dewey's Laboratory School, where Dewey tested his hypotheses regarding how people learn and how education can further social progress. MacClintock, whose mother taught at the school, donated these photographs, which depict classroom scenes, student art and projects, dramatic scenes, and various group and individual activities.

Special Collections—Miscellaneous

Dunham, Katherine Photograph Collection 55

ca. 1910s-1960s

This large collection complements the papers of Katherine Dunham, Faculty Papers 20-7-F1, in the University Archives. Dunham, an internationally renowned dancer, choreographer, and dance teacher, is a native of Joliet, Illinois. She was one of the first African Americans to attend the University of Chicago, where she earned bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in anthropology. Dunham taught at SIUE beginning in 1967. The collection includes images of Dunham, her family, her dance troupes, other artists and celebrities, her world travels, her dance schools, and scenes of her teaching at SIUE. There are also approximately 400 photos taken by Dunham in the Caribbean while she was doing research for her Master's degree in the 1930s.

Barreda-Sherman, Frederick Manuscript Collection 178

ca. 1850s - 1880s

This collection contains reprinted photographs relating to the career of Peruvian diplomat and businessman Federico Luciano Barreda y Aquilar and his wife. Barreda was, at one point, ambassador to the new administration of Abraham Lincoln and was also involved in diplomatic relations with several European countries. The photos depict European and American aristocracy in the 19th century.

Crosby, Caresse
Photograph Collection 49
ca. 1920s -1960s

Caresse Crosby, poet, patron of the arts, and cofounder of the Black Sun Press, was part of the American expatriate literary and artistic establishment in Paris during the 1920s, along with her husband and fellow poet, Harry Crosby. This collection, which complements Manuscript Collection 140, contains all the photographs in Caresse Crosby's personal collection at the time of her death. The collection contains photographs of Caresse, Harry, their family, friends, and associates, and their artwork. Aubrey Beardsley, Kay Boyle, Jean Cocteau, Hart Crane, Salvador Dali, Ernest Hemingway, Roger Lescaret, Henry Miller, and Ezra Pound are among those pictured.

This collection includes photographs of Joyce and his family and friends, various renditions of Joyce, and photos and drawings of buildings and monuments related to Joyce.
